A VILLAGE IN THE VALE

The Village Hall, Hunters Field, Stanford in the Vale, SN7 8LR

Saturday 20th May 2017

Stanford in the Vale was once a village of small farms, and a market town, and there were eight inns and beer houses here in the nineteenth century. Further employment was provided by food retailers, two mills, a blacksmith, the school and churches. There was also a quarry for local stone, to be seen in many of the attractive cottages, some of which date from the seventeenth century. Stanford was the birthplace of Pam Ayres.

10.00 A failed mediaeval market town on the River Ock

Dr David Ashby grew up in Southmoor, attended Faringdon School and while helping Stanford scouts started researching the village history. He began excavations as part of his undergraduate studies in 2008, and has a BA, an MA and a doctorate from the University of Winchester. He is currently employed by that university and is Director of the Stanford in the Vale Archaeological Research Project.

11.45 A brief history of Shellingford's Second World War airfield

Philip Morris, B.Ed, FRGS, was raised in Bedfordshire. He initially followed a cartographic career, firstly with the Admiralty Hydrographic Service, then in the Royal Engineers at the School of Military Survey, followed by eight years at the Ordnance Survey. A career change involved four years at the University of Southampton, and a first teaching post in Basingstoke. He moved to Stanford on becoming Head of Humanities at Icknield School in Wantage. Phil has tutored many WEA adult courses and edits The Stanford Historian.
